#### From the Pastor's Desk

Mark 1:15: "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news." (from the New Revised Standard Version of the bible)

The Greek word commonly translated as repent, *metanoia*, is Jesus' first proclamation upon beginning his ministry, as captured in Mark 1:15 printed above. The English word *repent* has an unfortunate negative connotation, bringing to mind regret, grief, and sorrow over sinful deeds that leads to a change of mind and life. Many scholars dating back to church father Tertullian argue that the word *metanoia* is better translated in different ways. Tertullian asserted that "in Greek, *metanoia* is not a confession of sins but a change of mind," and offered the word *conversion* as a better translation for *metanoia*. The Merriam-Webster Dictionary gives this transliteration: "a transformative change of heart; *especially*: a spiritual conversion."

Therefore, at the very outset of his ministry, Jesus is calling his followers to fundamentally change their minds and way of life in order to align with the onset of the Kingdom of God in the present moment. Acknowledgement of the reality of the Kingdom of God over and against the illusion of the powers of the world in our thoughts is therefore the first step; living out that belief with action follows.

As I write these words, the 1992 hit pop song "Free Your Mind" is echoing in my head. Sung by the group En Vogue, the lyrics describe instances of African-American women experiencing prejudicial racism in their everyday lives. The chorus perfectly captures the idea of *metanoia* in their context:

Why oh why must it be this way
Before you can read me you gotta learn how to see me, I said
Free your mind and the rest will follow
Be color blind, don't be so shallow.
Free your mind and the rest will follow

Be color blind, don't be so shallow


How are we, as a congregation and community, called to align our minds, hearts, and actions with the proclamation of Jesus for *metanoia*, for conversion, for transformation? All too commonly, followers of The Way are resistant to change. Is this congregation more committed to preserving the traditions and the status quo than to engage in transformation? How can we grasp the concept of *metanoia* in our context in Red Hook? How can we shift our mindset toward the positivity of change and hope for a bright future? And importantly, how do we transform an acceptance of change in our minds into concrete actions that demonstrate our commitment to Jesus' *metanoia*?

I see lots of hopeful signs of *metanoia* in our congregation. In hallway conversations, in meetings, in actions taken, and in dreams shared, we are stepping in the right direction. I pray that we continue to persevere in the task before us as disciples of Jesus. I call upon God for the blessing of transformation, and for the patience and openness to share and listen to one another as we journey forward together into a future that is different from our present.


