### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR NIKKI'S DESK

Psalm 77:16-20 (New Revised Standard Version):

16 When the waters saw you, O God,
when the waters saw you, they were afraid;
the very deep trembled.

17 The clouds poured out water;
the skies thundered;
your arrows flashed on every side.

18 The crash of your thunder was in the whirlwind;
your lightnings lit up the world;
the earth trembled and shook.

19 Your way was through the sea,
your path, through the mighty waters;
yet your footprints were unseen.
20 You led your people like a flock
by the hand of Moses and Aaron.

I am in the midst of reading a book by Thomas Friedman entitled, "Thank You for Being Late: An Optimist's Guide to Thriving in an Age of Accelerations." At one point in the book, the author uses a powerful metaphor of kayaking on rough rapids to describe the best strategy for navigating the hectic pace of technological and social change in which we are currently embedded worldwide. Friedman points out that to deny that we as a society are in the rapids—the pace of change on many fronts is multiplying at an unprecedented compound rate—is to deny reality. Instead, we as individuals and as a group must use techniques to keep the boat afloat in the rough waters of change. To attempt to put the brakes on the kayak, to drag your paddle like a rudder, is to invite capsize in dangerous white water. Instead, we must lean forward into the challenge and paddle with determination, paddling at a rate even faster than the rushing water, in order to successfully make it through the rapids. Societal change is best navigated by moving with purpose along with the current.

I really like this metaphor. It has a lot of power to illustrate where we are as a people of faith today. The world surrounding us is changing very rapidly. Things are definitely not the same as they were a few decades ago. Things are not even the same as they were a year ago! The waters we are navigating, as described in Psalm 77 above, seem treacherous and stormy. We look upon

these waters with a lot of fear. We do not know these waters, but we do know that we can get hurt while floating in them if we don't know how to paddle! The good news is that God does not leave us alone in the hazardous rapids. Even when the waters swell and rush at dangerous speeds, we can choose to recognize that God holds sovereignty over the storm. Indeed, we are told in verses 19-20 above that God's path is right through the white water! And God is leading us on this path.

Just like kayaking in river rapids, we as a church cannot deny that we are in the water. We cannot try to stop the flow. We cannot try to slow down our boat by using our paddle as a rudder. We cannot focus on "the way things used to be." God's plan is to forge safe passage through the water. We must choose to accept the challenge ahead, lean into the fast current, and stroke our paddles with gusto to follow along the course God is plotting.

I have complete faith that this Red Hook congregation has the tools, strength, willpower, and deep faith to follow our God through the rapids of change. I pray for our continued safety and transformation on this exhilarating journey! Amen!




