Ash Wednesday, one of the oldest of our Christian, non-Biblical traditions dating to the First Council of Nicaea in 325 CE. It's been observed for a long time and I believe for good reason. Lent is the time for self seeking, for real self-directed honesty and self assessment. Lent is the time for accepting our helplessness and our inability to live out our "calling" on our own.

Our "calling" is known only to each one of us. It's private, it's secret until we act upon it. There's no telling where that "calling" might go, what it might lead to, the ones your special "calling" might touch.

Part of that process, the process of bringing your "calling" to fruition is the focus of Lent. Self examination and contrition for our short-comings. Those burdens of the heart, those secrets of the mind that distract our attention and energy. Those parasitic desires and longings, draining our power of Spirit and finance. How can we fulfill our true "calling" or our purpose when we are so spent.

The Psalmist cries out, (Psalm 51:1) "Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy, blot out my transgressions."

Holy One, Indeed, "have mercy" and "blot out our transgressions". Help us to take the time for true introspection during these forty days, these forty Holy days, and help us to take full advantage of your "steadfast Love", so that on Good Friday we can pin our clutter to the cross, as is your intent and desire. Free us from our deep seated demons so that each of us, in concert with your Holy Spirit and each other, will live to the fullest, your true "calling" for each one of us.

February 2020 "Leap Year"

To keep our calendar aligned with the astronomical world in which we live, we must occasionally add a day to the year. Otherwise we will drift away from the Solar System. We don't do this too often. The error is small, and it gets corrected by adding 99 days in every 400 years, or about 1 day every 4 years. We will have one of the "Leap Days" at the end of this month, February 29. In a similar way, we must occasionally "leap" in our own lives, or we will slowly drift away from God's plan for us. The drift is gradual, and goes mostly unnoticed. Similar to the calendar, it happens not over the course of just a week or two, but several years. We start out okay, and think that we are following God's plan, but over weeks, months, years, things start to go off a bit. It is difficult to tell. Small little differences. Nothing too dramatic. But we find ourselves a few years later needing to make a "leap" to return to God. This is the reality of living in Christ. It is a path of constant correction, except that we humans don't really make constant correct, do we? So, instead, we drift away. And then, we find that we've lost the path. So, later on this month, when you observe "Leap Day" in whatever way you want to, remember also to adjust your path back to God's plan. How far has your path drifted from His? How big a leap back to Jesus do you need to make?
